# Historical Roots

Samuel Purinton grew up in the Swansea Friends Meeting, a community located in the area now called Somerset. The story is that Samuel fell in love with a woman who was not a Quaker. When he presented his beloved to the Friends Meeting, they did not approve of his choice. Rather than forsake his love, he broke with the congregation.

He soon found that there were others who shared his sentiments. A small group gathered and formed "The Christian Band." While ministers gathered people together in homes and offered worship, no organized church existed in the Pottersville area at that time. Thanks to the work of visiting clergy, particularly Mr. George Kilton of Rehoboth, many conversations took place. Samuel Purinton had a desk made in his home in order that he might feed the hungry souls.

Desiring a closer, more formal bond, the Pottersville group formed themselves into a Christian Band of Thirty (30) members. Soon they determined it was time to formalize with denominational affiliation and a building.

# Our Church Grows

In October 1840, the Pottersville group sought pledges to support a new building; raising \$1,200. Construction began in November 1840 and was completed in May 1841. Much of the work was done by shipwrights.

A close look at the church building's structure is example similar to ship workmanship.

On May 26, 1841, a double ceremony was held dedicating the new meeting house and formally affiliating with the Christian denomination. By 1842, the church had a membership of one hundred (100) people. Eunice Purington, Samuel's daughter, created a sampler of the church as it look originally. The Church's Historical Committee today maintains and displays this sampler.

Denominational affiliation of the congregation changed several times as the denominations themselves grew and developed. In 1912, the church incorporated as the First Christian Church of Somerset. In 1931, when the Christian Church & Congregational churches merged, we became the Congregational Christian Church of Somerset.

In 1957, the Congregational Christian Churches merged with the Evangelical and Reformed Church into the new denomination, The Church of Christ.

Some well known names that have had a large impact through their involvement in our church and the community are Frances & Elsie - the Hathaway Sisters and Reverend Dr. H. Merrill Emery and his wife Constance Emery.
